
Floor boards Instructions for use

The floor board kit comprises a number of strips of wood marked with joins and nails and a double sided adhesive backing sheet which allows sections of the flooring to be assembled on the bench and then stuck into place in the house or roombox.



- 1. Peel off the backing from one side of the adhesive sheet and lay the strips onto the sheet carefully aligning the ends.
- 2. If a larger area is to be covered using more than one pack of flooring it is important to ensure that the floor boards are staggered so that all the joins do not coincide. To do this place the two pieces of adhesive sheet together and lay some of the strips across the join. The strips can be cut where the joins are marked so that they can be assembled in a different sequence as shown in the diagram.
- 3. The surplus adhesive material can be trimmed off using scissors or a craft knife.
- 4. Lightly sand the floor with fine sandpaper, if necessary, to get a smooth finish.
- 5. The completed floor section can be treated with liquid wax or stained and varnished. Use a matt or satin varnish gloss varnish is usually too shiny and does not look realistic especially in the smaller scales.
- 6. Finally remove the backing from the rear of the sheet and fix in position in the house or roombox.



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
